1. What's your role at Peabody?

Customer Services officer.

2. What brought you to Peabody?

I came to Charlton Triangle Homes by chance. In March 2007, I was walking along Tower Bridge Road, and I saw a recruitment sign - for helping people back to work. I popped in and enquired. I met this lovely lady; she told me that "Charlton Triangle Homes is looking for someone to volunteer to do archiving for 6 weeks". I jumped at the chance, and she signed me up. The next day, she took me to Charlton on the bus. She introduced me to the manager at the time. I did archiving for 6 weeks, and when it came to the end, I continued volunteering. Then I was on agency pay. And on the 1st August 2007 – I was employed and became a member of staff. The rest is history.

Before Peabody took over, the organisation was "Family Mosaic". My passion for working with people started when I was a young child, and this passion has taken me into my adulthood. When I decided that I wanted to work in the housing sector, I enrolled at Hackney College and gained a National Certificate in the Housing – Management and Maintenance Pathway (Level 3) in 2003. After I had finished college, I volunteered at the Guinness Housing Trust in Hackney for nearly 2 years before I came to Charlton Triangle Homes.

3. What are you working on at the moment?

I am the first point of contact at the New Leaf Centre. My day-to-day job is making sure that everything is running smoothly. Some of the things I do are booking appointments, reminder calls, health & safety checks, admin, logging interactions on CRM, and banking. At the moment, I am calling a few of the elderly residents to see how they are getting on. I have been keeping in touch with some of them since the start of Covid-19. Covid may have stopped, but Ionie is still ongoing.

There are quite a few, but my favourite is People! Seeing someone happy that I have helped makes me happy...

My eldest granddaughter has not been well recently but is still trying to maintain her hobbies in photography and the arts; my second granddaughter attends a private school and is eager to do her GCSEs later this year. She was voted "Class Captain" on the first week of attending. Since then, they have voted for her four more times, and she is doing the role at present. A few weeks ago, she was awarded a "Sports Scholarship". My sisters are my best friends. As stated above – seeing someone happy that I have helped makes me happy. So, there is something to be proud of and smile about. This is to show that it does not matter about your background. Living in social housing, one can still excel very high.

I am living in a rented Housing Association flat. My favourite room is my bedroom.

I am a new author. My second book has now been published. It is a book of poems that I have collated over the last 7 years. All these poems came to me at random.
