Director's Report

Throughout 2023 the Team at Charlton have worked tirelessly to bring the community together despite the challenges brought about by the ever present cost of living crisis and all things associated with the on-going recovery from the pandemic years.

The outdoor gym, officially launched in May 2023, kicked the year off to a flying start and has provided much needed facilities for all age groups throughout the summer and winter months.

We have reconnected with our community, facilitating and organising a number of events and projects: Using our community café to host both Easter and Black History Month events for our younger residents, officially opening three play areas for the under 5s, opening the office to raise money for breast cancer in the summer and hosting projects and activities for young people including the Charlton Triangle Homes football league.

This year we sponsored our first all-girls football team from Eglinton Primary School supplying the team with football kit in their school colours. The Kings' Coronation in May gave us another opportunity to open the office and offer tea and cake with several stalls provided by members of the local community.

Our 50 Plus group arranged trips and outings throughout the year including a couple of coastal trips, a stately home visit, and a mystery tour which took them to Amberley Museum in West Sussex. The museum had something for everyone and became the most talked about trip of the year. A permanent feature in the Over 50s calendar is the Christmas party and this year's event, held at Blackheath Rugby Club was as fantastic as ever, with everyone eating, dancing and celebrating the season to the full.

Our New Leaf Food Cabin continues to offer its services to a growing membership and final plans to relocate the cabin are underway in order to expand its services. Our summer provision offered a plentiful and varied programme; cooking, photography and baking all proved very popular this year, together a variety of sports and outdoor activities run by Charlton Athletic Community Trust (CACT) London Knightz hockey sessions and tag rugby provided by Blackheath Rugby Club.

We continue to invest in our properties with the final year of our three year door replacement programme scheduled for completion in 2024-25. On Springfield, we have one lift undergoing works and scheduled to be completed by April 2024 - leaving a further two lifts to be replaced in 2024-

25, in order to complete the programme.

The Charlton Family Centre is scheduled to reopen in the Spring offering services to families and under 5s from three separate organisations: The food pantry, Cherry Orchard School and the Quaggy Trust.

Looking forward to 2024 we have our Blaker Court Development offering fourteen new flats including one, two and three bed units scheduled for completion in March 2024. We will also be concentrating on more investment works including; our rolling fire safety programme, refurbishment of some play areas together with roof replacement, extensive drainage works and a resumption of our cyclical decs programme after several years of suspension.

Let's hope that 2024 proves to be a time of rebuilding and maintaining existing relationships and working hard to forge new partnerships in an effort to further consolidate and grow our local community.
